**Executive summary**

- **A brief overview of the school's pupil premium strategy so far, what has worked and what hasn't**  
 Following the 2017 Ofsted inspection (14-15<sup>th</sup> March) West Vale was put into Special Measures. A review of PP was requested. The Acting Headteacher identified the school's issues, only part of which are currently PP issues. There was no governor for PP and little existing leadership until Chris Whiteman took over as Acting HT. I was unable to work with a member of staff responsible for PP, although Sarah Grondalski and Sally Scott were able to support me with data.  
 There was no coherent PP Strategy, data to show how last year's funding had been spent and the school's website was not compliant in terms of information on Disadvantaged pupils.  
 Looking at data and visiting classrooms it was clear that the problems for PP children are mirrored by those for non-PP children, GD is largely non-existent in data, teaching had lacked high expectations and/or coherency, use of TAs has been weak in parts of the school and, learning environments were sometimes uninspiring. Differentiation is still lacking in most books looked at as part of this review. The lack of quality leadership prior to Chris's appointment has held back progress for the PP group.
- **The core approaches that will now be implemented and how these will contribute to closing gaps**  
 The first action, therefore was to ensure the school was compliant. A Pupil Premium Policy and strategy document were created and made available to the school to put onto the website. School visits were made to explore data and to visit classrooms to see provision in action.
- **The overall aims of the plan**

  - Reduce attainment gap between the school's disadvantaged pupils and others nationally in all year groups
  - Raise the in-school attainment of both disadvantaged pupils and their peers
