

## West Vale Primary School Sports Grant Plan 2017 to 2018

### What is Primary PE Sports Grant?

The Government is providing additional sports grant to improve provision of Physical Education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This grant - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - will be allocated by primary school headteachers. This grant is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools and training for the sustainability of sport in school.

### How will the grant be spent?

At West Vale School, we have developed an action plan to ensure that the money is spent on initiatives which will have a long lasting impact on the future learning and physical development of children within our school. All of grant and more has been spent on employing a full-time sports coach in order to ensure high quality P.E. lessons for all. We are members of the Calderdale Schools Sport Programme and have joined with other local schools, to form a cluster, lead by The Brooksbank School
